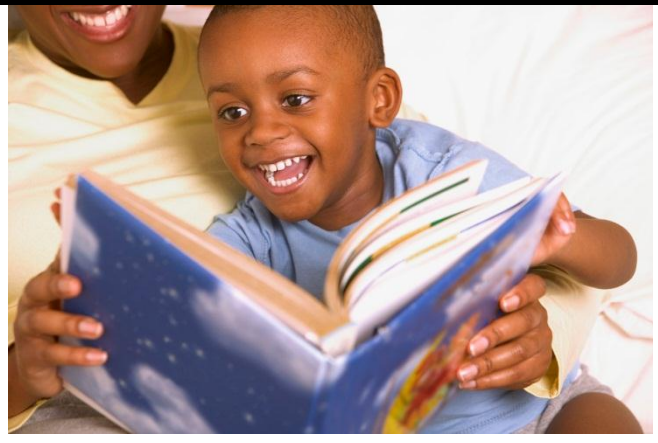
Students in grades K-2 can go here to build words. Pick an ending and then see how many words you can make using that ending.
